Converse

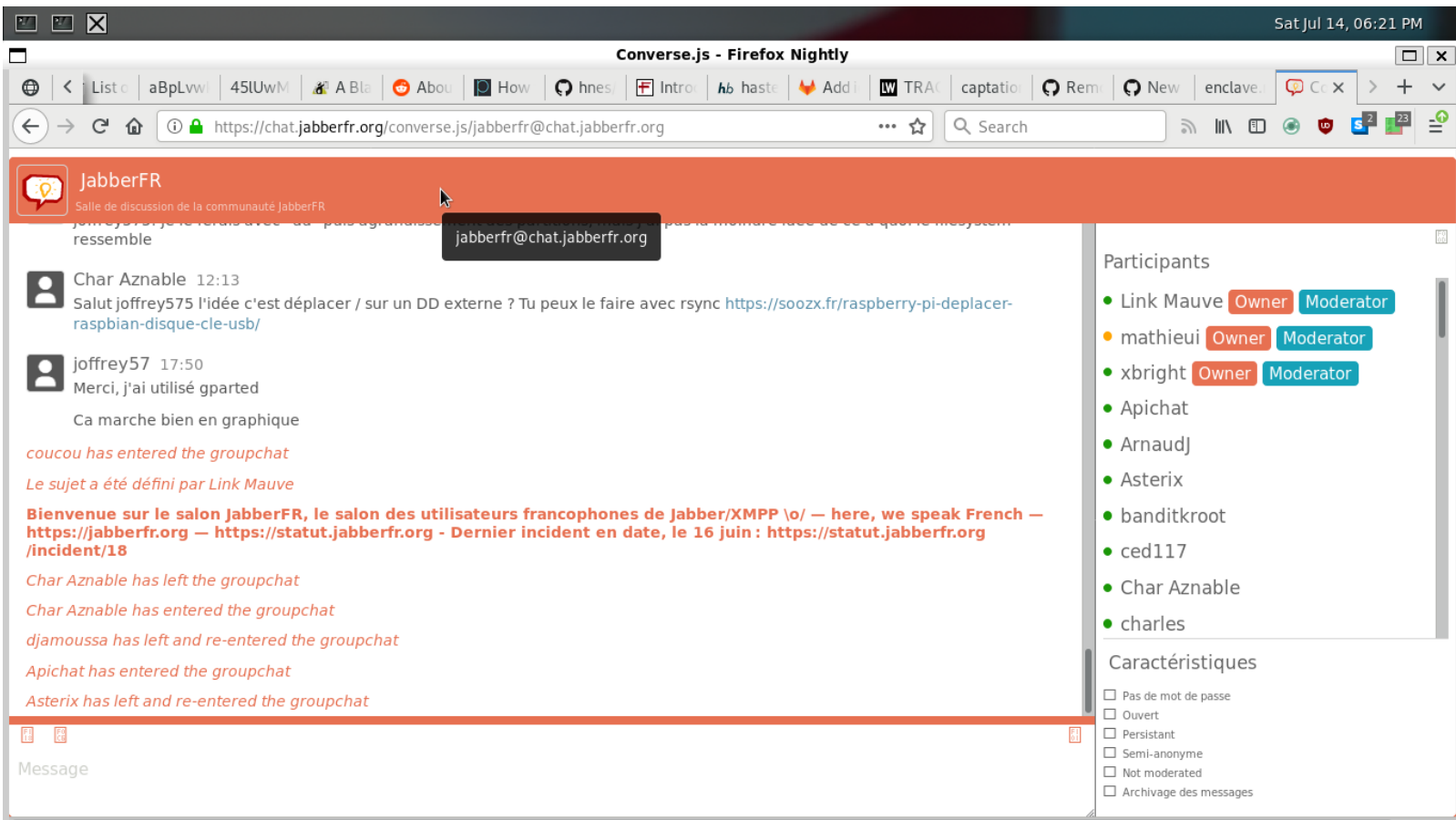
Converse is a free and open-source XMPP chat client in your browser.
